### Abstract Submission

Authors are encouraged to submit an abstract before drafting a full manuscript to ensure that content is aligned to the unique mission of Michigan Journal of Sustainability (MJS). Content should bridge the science-policy-public divide. MJS editors will accept timely, innovative, and informative scholarly articles translating research at the human-environment interface, emphasizing the role of human behavior in sustainability. Abstracts are limited to 300 words, excluding references, and should include:

- A description of the content focus, and the type of article you plan to submit, see: content types.
- How your work is relevant to an interdisciplinary audience of academics, practitioners, and/or policy makers.
